8. Sharing Text without Authentication

There are a lot of users who share Quranic interpretation without any authenticity. They just share rumors and wrong meaning interpreted but various illiterate persons serving their own views.

Many of the people change the meaning of verse according to their own benefits and they just do “Tehreef in meaning” As Quran says^{vii}

Many of us share their content without any research or discussing it with ulemas hence controversial issues take part.

So we should have a deep research before sharing such content about Quran, Hadith & other Islamic personalities.

As Quran says in surah^{viii}

يَا أَيُّهَا الَّذِينَ آمَنُوا إِنْ جَاءَكُمْ فَاسِقٌ بِنَبَأٍ فَتَبَيَّنُوا أَنْ تُصِيبُوا قَوْمًا بِجَهَالَةٍ فَتُصْحَبُوا عَلَىٰ مَا فَعَلْتُمْ لِنَدْمِينَ

O believers, if an evildoer brings you any news, verify it so you do not harm people unknowingly, becoming regretful for what you have done.
